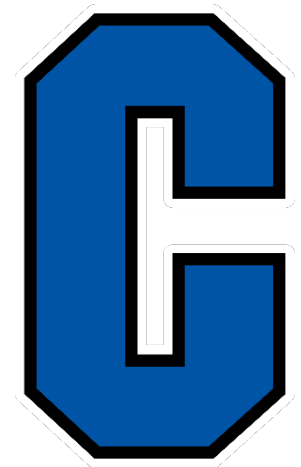

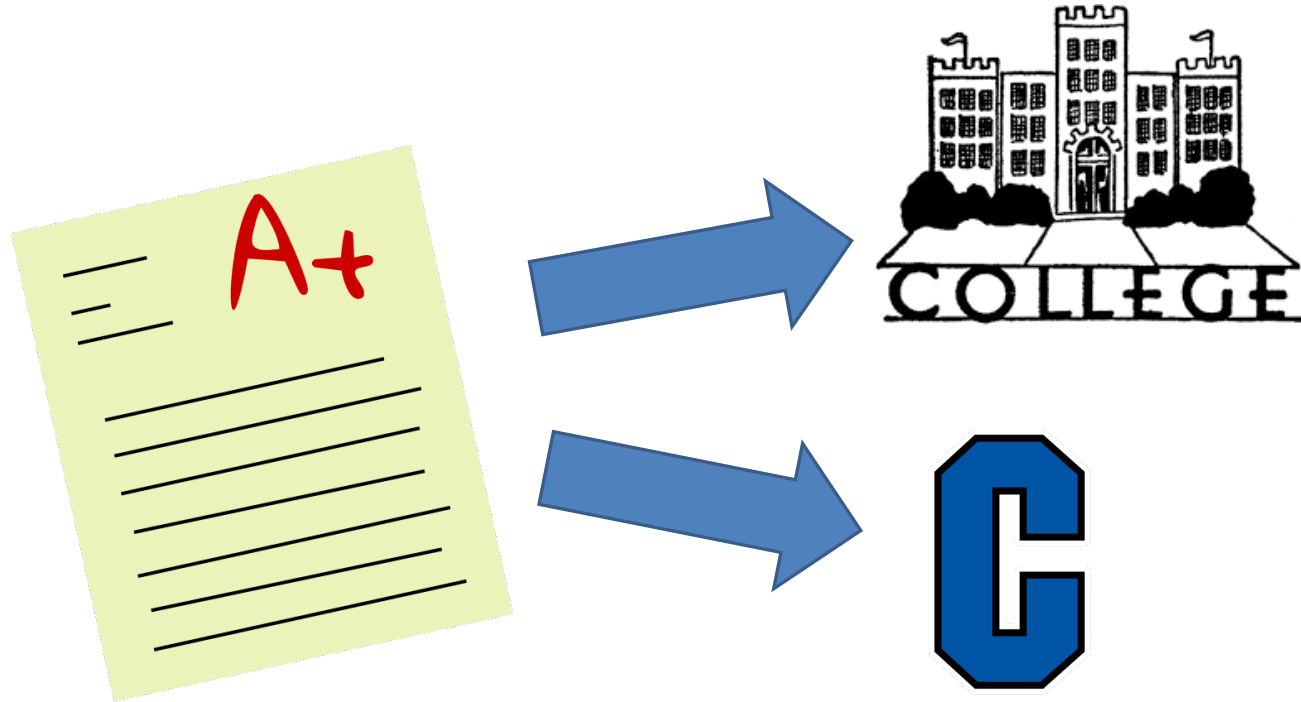

WHAT IS DUAL ENROLLMENT?

The **DUAL ENROLLMENT** program is an opportunity for qualified high school students to simultaneously earn college and high school credit while enrolled at Centennial High School as a high school student.



Students may participate as full-time (4+ DE COURSES) or part-time (hybrid of DE/CHS courses that total 6 courses) students.

Students earn college credits while meeting high school graduation requirements.

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?



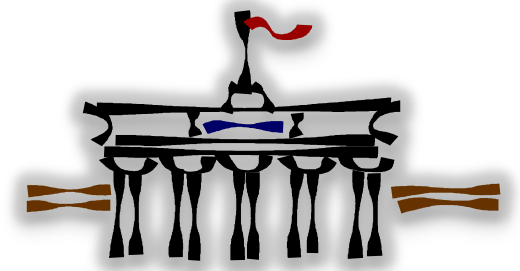
- **10th-12th grade students are eligible to participate; however, colleges may have age/grade requirements as part of their admissions policy.**
- **GWINNETT TECHNICAL COLLEGE will accept 10th-12th grade students.**
- **GEORGIA STATE-PERIMETER COLLEGE will accept 11th-12th grade students.**

10TH GRADE RESTRICTIONS



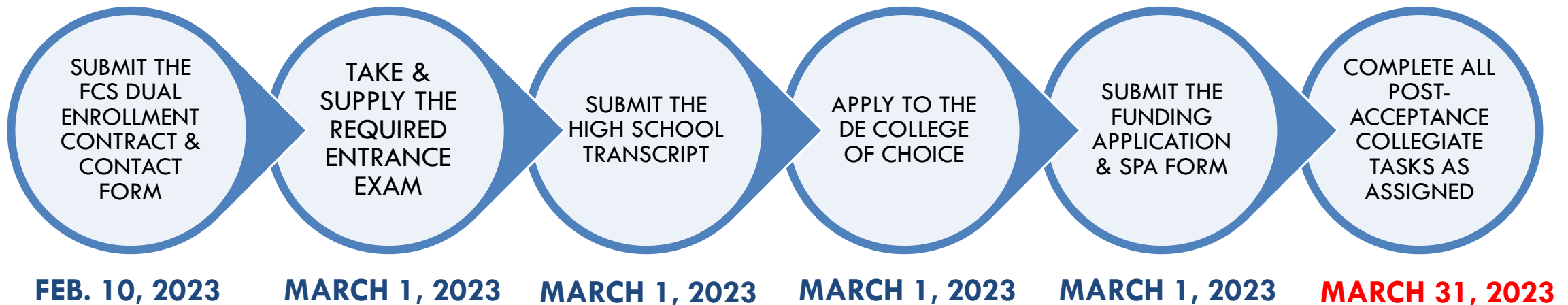
- Eligible students may enroll in approved Career, Technical and Agricultural Education (CTAE) courses listed on the Course Directory at a participating TCSG institution only.
- Eligible students who have a minimum SAT score of 1200 or minimum ACT composite score of 26 in a single national test administration, may enroll in any approved course listed on the Course Directory at a TCSG, USG or private eligible participating postsecondary institution.

HOW DO I PARTICIPATE?



Students may apply to any **participating*** public college, private college, or technical college in Georgia. Students; however, must consider access to the college when selecting their DE institution.

HOW DOES GRADING WORK?

✓ If colleges provide the high school with letter grades, Centennial will transcribe the letter grade to a numeric grade in accordance with District Board Policy IH, VII:

A = 95

B = 85

C = 75

D = 70 (IF CREDIT BEARING)

F = 60

- ✓ **7 points are added to the final passing grade of all DE courses**
- ✓ **Failed DE courses may jeopardize student graduation status. Anticipated course failures should be immediately reported to the CHS counselor**
- ✓ **All dual enrollment classes are included on both the high school & college transcript.**

CREDIT CONVERSION

- ▶ **1 - 2 semester hour college classes = .5 HS credit.**
- ▶ **3 - 5 semester hour college classes = 1.0 HS credit.**

***Science labs will receive .5 HS credit and will count toward HS elective credit. They will not count towards the fourth science requirement. ***

UPON HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION, HOW WILL POST-SECONDARY INSTITUTIONS USE THE DUAL ENROLLMENT CREDITS?

Colleges/Universities decide, independently, how they will use dual enrollment credits. Credits may fulfill collegiate core/major course requirements or elective course requirements. It is the responsibility of the student/family to review the dual enrollment policy of their college(s) of interest.

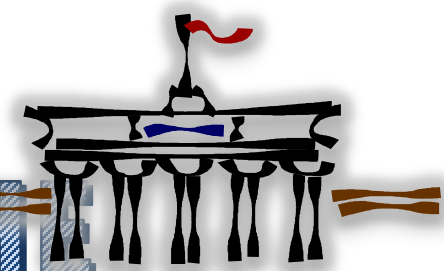

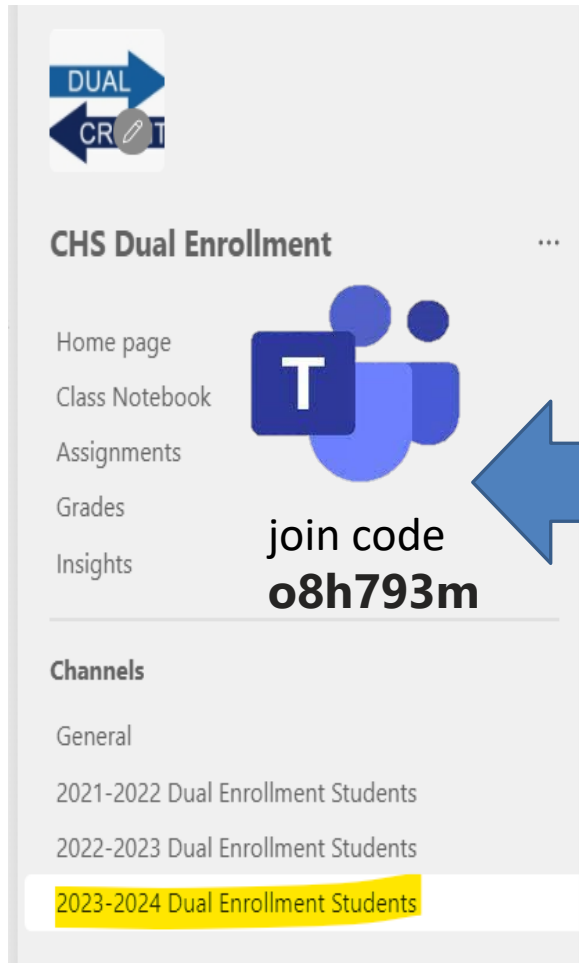


WHAT ARE THE DE ROLES OF THE CHS COUNSELOR, THE CHS AND THE COLLEGE DE COORDINATORS?



CHS COUNSELOR	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• To assist students with course selection, ensuring that students are meeting graduation requirements
CHS DUAL ENROLLMENT COORDINATOR	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• To facilitate the dual enrollment <u>application</u> process• To approve DE course additions and course withdrawals (for funding purposes)• To receive final grades and to report final grades to counselors for CHS transcription purposes
COLLEGE DUAL ENROLLMENT COORDINATOR	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• To facilitate the dual enrollment <u>engagement</u> process (registration, orientation, academic calendar provisions, etc.)• To effectively communicate student DE participation needs to <u>student</u> DE participants• To finalize the approval/denial of DE course funding requests• To provide final DE grades to Centennial High School

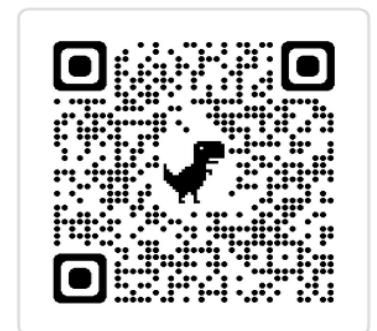

DUAL ENROLLMENT

Georgia State's dual enrollment program offers eligible high school juniors and seniors the chance to take undergraduate classes for college credit. Participate in dual enrollment on any of our six campuses (Georgia State's Atlanta Campus + five Perimeter College campuses) or online in the fall, spring or summer semesters of the academic year.

MAY 1

DUAL ENROLLMENT

DE: Dual Enrollment: Program that allows high school students to earn college credit while working on their high school diploma. Uses DE funding until exhausted

JE: Joint Enrollment: Program that allows high school students to earn college credit, self-pay

EC: Early College: Program that allows high school students to earn college credit while working on their high school diploma. Uses DE funding until exhausted

GSU Programs for HS Students

DUAL ENROLLMENT



- Classes with traditional undergraduate students
- Receive high school/college credit
 - ~*Does not take away from HOPE benefits*
- Courses must be selected from state approved lists
 - Students can self-pay for courses not on DE Course Directory

Dual Enrollment at Georgia State

- Students are enrolled as Non-Degree seeking student type (no major is assigned)
- If student wants to pursue the Associates pathway will be declared when applying for graduation
- Students can take classes during the regular Fall, Spring, or Summer semesters
 - If student exhaust funds student can self-pay for courses
- Access to campus facilities, clubs & student life activities
~*(Excluding Greek organizations)*

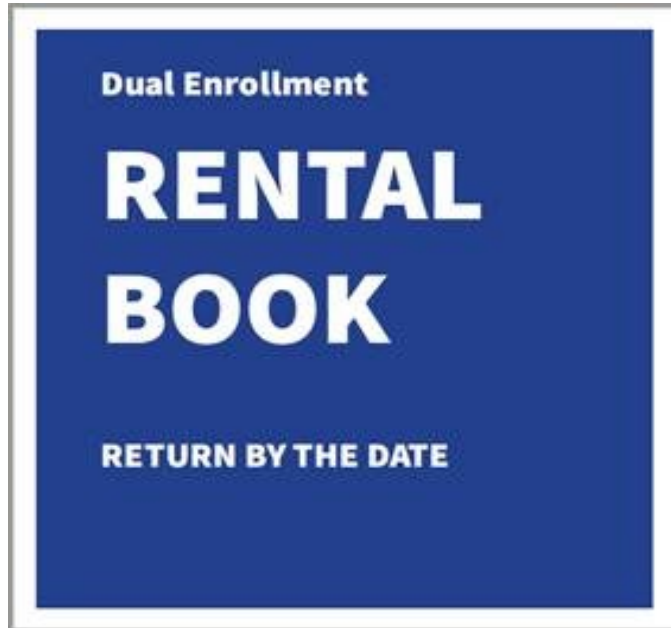
DUAL ENROLLMENT



Cost

- Tuition is covered by Georgia Student Finance Commission (GFCS)
 - Courses must be selected from state approved list
 - Non-funded classes must be paid for at the time of registration
- Mandatory university fees are waived if student has 1 or more DE funds remaining
- **Student Responsibilities:**
 - Course specific fees: (Ex: science or foreign language)
 - Transportation
 - Parking and meals

Textbooks



- The Georgia State University Bookstore will loan students required books, codes, materials
- Must be returned at the end of each semester in good condition
- Must pick up and return during dates set by bookstore

Benefits of Dual Enrollment

- Pass the course: you will receive college credit
- Lighten the AP/IB course/testing load for advanced students
- Opportunity to grow and mature
 - Handle college registration
 - Requesting transcripts
 - Communicating with college professors



Requirements & Considerations

- Must be a rising Junior or Senior in high school
- Must obtain approval from HS counselor & parent/guardian

- Atlanta: On campus only (1000-4000 level courses)
- Perimeter: Online or on campus (1000-2000 courses)

DUAL ENROLLMENT



Core Curriculum

A dual enrollment student must have completed Algebra II or higher in order to take collegiate-level math.

GPA Requirement: 3.0 (Core Classes)

SUBJECT	UNITS	COURSES:
ENGLISH	4	Any 4 English/Language Arts
MATH	4	Algebra I, Algebra II, Geometry & 1 Higher Level Math
NATURAL SCIENCE	4	1 Life Science/Lab, 1 Physical Science/Lab, & 2 Science Electives
SOCIAL SCIENCE	3	1 U.S. History, 1 World History & 1 Social Science Elective
FOREIGN LANGUAGE	2	Both units must be the same language. American Sign Language is acceptable.

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DUAL ENROLLMENT

Perimeter Campus Testing Requirements

ACT: 20 English or Reading & 21 Math
SAT: 530 Evidence-Based Reading, 530 Math
PSAT: 530 Evidence-Based Reading and Writing, 530
Math **(Same as SAT)**

PSAT scores can be sent by HS counselor on HS letter head

Accuplacer: 237 Nex-Gen Reading, 258 Nex-Gen QAS
(Math), Writeplacer 4-8

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Atlanta Campus Testing Requirements

ACT:	23 English & 23 Math
SAT:	580 Evidence-Based Reading, 560 Math
PSAT:	580 Evidence-Based Reading and Writing, 560 Math (Same as SAT)

Freshman Index (FI) 2600 or higher

Panther Predictor (Online)

- The SAT FI formula is: $(500 \times \text{HSGPA}) + \text{SAT V} + \text{SAT M}$
- The ACT formula is $(500 \times \text{HSGPA}) + (\text{ACT composite} \times 42) + 88$

Students ***MUST*** meet all three requirements for admission. Students not meeting one or more of the requirements will not be admissible for participation in the program.

Deadlines

- **November 1st**

- Application and Documentation deadline for **SPRING 2023**

- **April 1st**

- Application and Documentation deadline for **SUMMER 2023**

- **May 1st**

- Application and Documentation deadline for **FALL 2023**



Student Expectations

- Demonstrate high academic and personal maturity
- Be prepared for college level course work at a research institution
- Communicate with your high school
- Ensure the college courses you select meet your HS graduation requirements

- Remember that your performance affects: HS GPA, HOPE, and college admissions



Parent Expectation

- Encourage your student with their coursework
- Professors and staff will not provide updates on student progress/performance in a course
- Students' grades remain part of **both** their high school and college record



FERPA

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA); a Federal law that protects the privacy of student education records.

~ **Once a student reaches 18 years of age or attends a postsecondary institution**, he or she becomes an "eligible student," and all rights formerly given to parents under FERPA transfer to the student, this includes the right to access records and right to have control over disclosure of personally identifiable information from the records

~ DE participants sign a FERPA waiver granting access for disclosure to the high school counselor. Students can grant access to parent/guardian.

2. Submit DE Application via www.gsu.edu
3. Submit Funding Application via www.gafutures.org
 - *Include SSN to prevent delays in releasing funds*
4. Submit final paperwork by deadline
 - *Transcripts*
 - *SAT/ACT scores*
